I. Call to Order – Mayor Schafer called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. CST

II. Presentation Agenda

1. Council Comments

- a. Mayor Schafer announced the next regularly scheduled Council Meeting will be held at 6:00 p.m. CST on Tuesday, March 18, 2014 in Council Chambers located at 5000 Diamondhead Circle
- b. Councilmember Knobloch provided an update on the street lights throughout the City. He and Councilmember LaFontaine have used maps provided by Coast Electric Power Association and conducted night-time inspection of the street lights throughout the city limits. In addition, both councilmen contacted other cities in Mississippi and Louisiana. Conclusion – No overall plan for where street lights were placed and no attention to bulb size and wattage used on poles. 400 watt fixtures are normally used in commercial areas with either 100 or 150 watts in residential areas. Operating costs are as follows:

\$25.00 per month for 400 watt fixtures

\$12.00 per month 150 watt fixtures

\$8.00 per month for 100 watt fixtures

The City currently expends between \$11,000 to \$12,000 a month for street lighting. Some areas have too much lighting while others have little or no lighting at all. Work will continue with Coast Electric to solve both situations and keep the costs within budget for street lighting. Councilmember Knobloch also provided an update on the recent meeting with American Medical Response. Average response time for AMR services to Diamondhead residents is approximately 13 minutes. Diamondhead Fire Department has an EMT on duty 24/7 that arrives on the scene first and provides level one care. AMR provides level two care and determines the next course of action. Hancock County pays AMR approximately \$18,000 per year to cover the entire county. AMR also bills for services through individual health care insurance. AMR transports to/from Gulfport Memorial Hospital and to Heart Hospital in Lacombe, LA. AMR also offers subscription services at a cost of \$40 - \$50 per year depending on whether or not medical insurance coverage is in force. Annual subscription to AMR service eliminates out-of-pocket expenses for the insured for services provided by AMR.

Councilmember Knobloch also announced the City of Diamondhead was recently accepted as one of 600 cities in "Keep America Beautiful" Campaign. Councilmember Knobloch expressed a special "thank you" to Paul Montjoy and everyone involved in the process.

- c. Councilmember LaFontaine announced Hancock County Solid Waste Authority awarded a 2-year contract for solid waste services for the county. Residents will not see an increase in fees. He did want to clarify that a 3% collection charge is added to fees by the Hancock Tax Assessor to cover shortfall, administration and clerical costs.

Councilmember LaFontaine motioned, seconded by Councilmember Rech, to accept and renew Property Insurance Coverage (schedule of value for equipment at \$127,299) written through Essex Insurance Company and underwritten by Stewart, Sneed, Hewes Insurance at a renewal premium in the amount of \$2,232.95.

Councilmember Rech motioned, seconded by Councilmember Knobloch, to accept the sole bid received for lease purchase financing for Public Works vehicles from Hancock Bank; and furthermore, declaring the City has complied with the Mississippi Department of Finance's Mississippi Procurement Manual, Chapter 3, section 3.102.03.2 stating "If only one proposal is received in response to a Request For Proposal, the City may either make an award in accordance with the procedures set forth in Section 3.107, Competitive Sealed Bids Proposals, of the regulations or, if time permits, re-solicit for the purpose of obtaining competitive seal proposals. Competitive Sealed Proposals must be advertised according to MS Advertising Law of the Mississippi Procurement Manual Chapter 3 Section 3.106.05." Terms of the agreement with Hancock Bank are as follows:
