

**Resolution to Establish a Committee for the Inclusion of Diamondhead  
In the Annual "Cruisin' the Coast" Festivities and Activities**

Whereas, the City of Diamondhead was incorporated on January 30, 2012, as a municipality along the Mississippi Gulf Coast in Hancock County; and


Whereas, Diamondhead, like the other municipalities along the Mississippi Gulf Coast has a desire to participate in the activities which make life along the Mississippi Gulf Coast special and a great place to live, and


Whereas, there is a desire by the Mayor and City Council to participate in the annual automotive festival known as "Cruisin' the Coast", and

Whereas, the residents of Diamondhead possess a large number of classic, custom, vintage, sports and muscle cars, trucks and other specialized vehicles, and are passionate about said vehicles.

Therefore, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Diamondhead, that under the provisions of Mississippi Code Annotated Sections 17-3-1 through 17-3-31, do hereby appoint a committee to investigate and report on participation in "Cruisin' the Coast" effective with the 2013 execution of this annual event. Three members will be appointed to this committee with staggered terms of three years effective December 2012. This committee will be tasked to coordinate with the "Cruisin' the Coast" Committee, the local business owners, the Hancock County Chamber of Commerce, the Diamondhead Community Association, the Diamondhead Property Owners Association and the City Manager in developing a plan and seeking approval for use of property and facilities. Reporting on progress will be required at least monthly beginning January 2013. No binding contract will be signed or irrevocable pledge will be authorized without approval of the Mayor and City Council and appropriate action by the City Manager and/or City Clerk.
